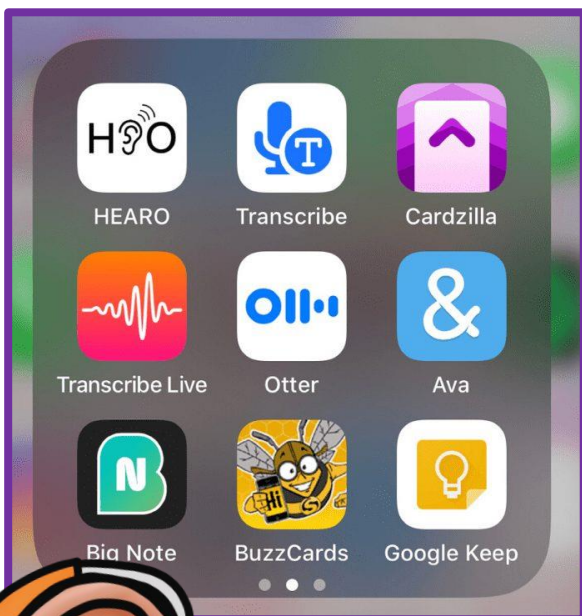

Tip of the Week:

VISUAL MEDIA ACCESS



Captions should always be used to provide visual media access. There are many live transcribe/ speech-to-text apps available. If the lights are dimmed during a media presentation, your student with hearing loss will not be able to speechread. Turn on the lights or summarize often for better access to the information. During student multimedia presentations, have the presenting student wear the mic. For questions, either pass around the mic, or repeat the question before answering.



Trick to Try:

If captioning is not available, let the student preview or review the film.

Provide the study guide or video script to follow along and highlight. Place the mic about 12 inches away from the audio-speaker or plug the transmitter into the audio-speaker.
